

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

# **IRL Honoring CART Vets' Status**

THE INDY Racing League will not require veteran drivers from the rival Championship Auto Racing Teams series to take rookie tests in order to enter the Indianapolis 500.

Normally, all new drivers - no matter how much experience they have had at other tracks - must take a rookie test before their first appearance at Indy. CART has boycotted Indianapolis since Speedway president Tony George founded the IRL in 1996, although a number of CART teams are expected to return for this year's race.

The IRL "will honor the CART status" of a driver at any league event, including the Indy 500, Brian Barnhart, IRL director of racing operations, said. "If the driver is a veteran, he does not have to take the rookie test because he has run (high-speed ovals) at Milwaukee, Nazareth (Pa.), Michigan and Fontana (Calif.).

"It's kind of silly to make a guy who's running a champ car with as much horsepower as they are come in and take a test," Barnhart said Tuesday. "It's more honoring their driver status and respecting what they've done instead of an enticement to come here. They've always been welcome."

Nineteen of the 36 drivers who competed in at least one CART race in 1999 have never driven at Indianapolis, including series champion Juan Montoya.

This year's CART rookies, however, will have to complete the four-phase Rookie Orientation Program at Indianapolis, along with all first-year IRL drivers. The annual rookie program is scheduled for April 7-8, with testing for veterans on April 9-10 and open testing for all drivers on April 11. Practice for the May 28 race will begin on May 13, with qualifications for the 33 starting positions on May 20-21.

Because there is a CART event scheduled the same weekend as the tests in April, Barnhart said the IRL also will try to be flexible with any CART teams who intend to compete at Indianapolis.

"If we get any kind of (good) weather, we have the possibility to extend the test for an extra day or two depending on construction schedules at the Speedway," he said.

The construction is for the U.S. Grand Prix Formula One race in September.

CART, which has scheduled a race the same week as the Indy 500 the past three years, left that week open on when it

announced its 2000 schedule in November, leading to speculation that some of its teams might return to Indianapolis. So far, however, the only CART team that has made a commitment to run at Indy is Walker Racing, which announced plans to compete in several IRL events in 2000.

Car owners Roger Penske and Chip Ganassi also are expected to return to Indy, although as many as a dozen more CART teams could enter the race, a source close to the teams told The Associated Press in November on condition of anonymity.

"Before CART cleared their schedule, who would have thought?" Speedway spokesman Fred Nation said Tuesday. "And then after they cleared their schedule, there have been two or three different periods when the guesses have varied greatly. Right now, it appears to be three teams. But who knows what it will be next month?

"Until the applications go out for the Indianapolis 500 at the end of January or early February, we won't really know," Nation said. "I would think people who are serious about being at Indy would make their decisions by then in order to make sure they have the equipment in time."

Barnhart said many of the CART teams already have contacted the IRL engine and chassis manufacturers, but no one has bought anything.

"The entry deadline is in mid-April, so they have until then to do it. But realistically, if they want to have any chance, they'll want to get the equipment and run it as much as possible before May rolls around."

The new IRL season opens at Walt Disney World Speedway in Florida on Jan. 29.

The 'Musket' is a place to see and enjoy.

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


1. S/C's short term goals are to have 2000 members by the year 2000!
